Background Information

City Exploration----- Wuhan

Gude Buddhist Temple



A historical Buddhist temple built in Hankou in 1877. It has buildings famous for combination of Asian and European religious architecture styles.

Yellow Crane Tower



A nation-wide famous tower built in Wuchang. The tower was first built in 223 A.D during the Three Kingdoms period, serving as a gathering place for celebrities and poets (including famous poets Cui Hao and Li Bai in Tang Dynasty).

Cruise tour on Yangtze River



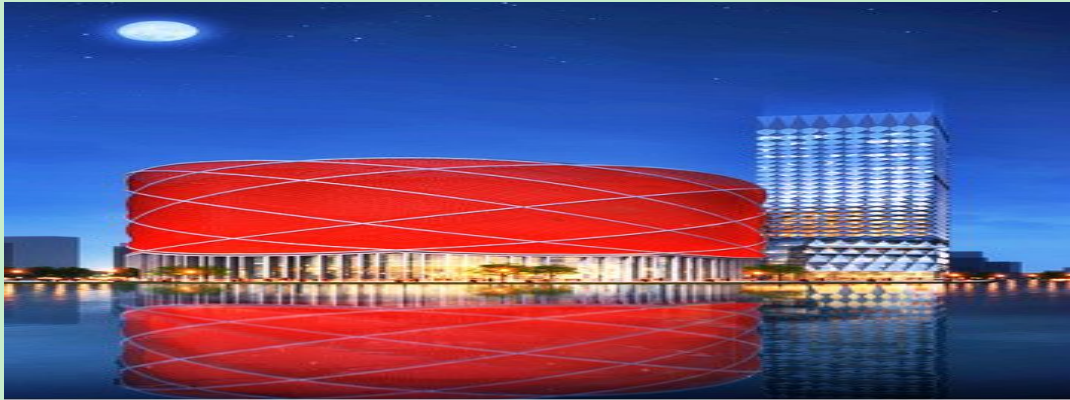
Close observation of Yangtze river, the longest river in Asia, and its beautiful scenery.

Hubei Provincial Museum



The center for collecting, studying, preserving and displaying historical and cultural relics in Hubei, especially famous for its collection of ancient relics from the tomb of marquis Yi of Zeng.

Wuhan Han Show Theatre



A place to appreciate Jing-Chu culture, a traditional culture in Wuhan city.

Tanhualin



Located at the northeast corner of Wuhan and lying between Huayuan Hill and Pangxiejia Hill, the block is filled with hoary walls, ancient steles, antiques stores and old consulates.

Hubuxiang



The best-known food street in Wuhan. First built in Ming Dynasty, it is a place famous for traditional Chinese architecture and good taste snacks.

Garden Exposition



Located in Hankou, Garden Exposition is a big and good-looking park with many beautiful trees, flowers and great lakes. It vividly shows the traditional Wuhan style and features.

The Journey of Silk Road-----Lanzhou

Yellow River Custom Line



Located in Lanzhou which is sandwiched by mountains on the northern and southern banks with the Yellow River going through. It contains a lot of scenic spots such as the Zhongshan Bridge, Waterwheel Museum Park, White Pagoda Hill Park and so on.

Gansu Provincial Museum



Built in 1959, it encompasses 21,000 square meters, with an exhibition space of 13,000 square meters. It exhibits historical relics, the Wei (220-265) and Jin (264-240) murals, the chart of the Silk Road, and other revolutionary cultural relics.

The Temple of Great Buddha



Covers an area of 23,000 square meters and the largest reclining buddha in China was stored here. It is a 4A scenic spot.

Colorful Danxia Landform



Also known as the eye candy of Zhangye. Many artists admire this masterpiece as it appears like a perfect painting on canvas. The Landform is surrounded by colorful hills, which seem to rise and fall like waves.

Jiayu Pass



6 kilometers far from the downtown of Jiayu city and located in southwest of the city. It was the main point of the west part of the Great Wall in Ming Dynasty.

Crescent Spring



At the foot of the mountain is a crystal-clear lake shaped like the crescent moon. Hence the name is the Crescent Moon Lake. The Sing Sand Mountain and Crescent Moon Spring is a rare desert view in the world.

Mogao Caves



Also known as the Caves of the Thousand Buddhas. It's a form of a system of 492 temples 25 km southeast of the center of Dunhuang, an oasis strategically located at a religious and cultural crossroads on the Silk Road in Gansu Province.

Application Qualifications

1. Students who are currently enrolled in an accredited college or university as well as high school seniors who have been accepted to an accredited college or university.
 2. Applicants should bear in mind that some of the activities in this summer program may be physically challenging and involve intensive interpersonal interaction.
- Candidates who will be able to get the most out of the exchange program are those who have related skills to meet these requirements.

Credit Transfer

1. Students will be assessed in the way as follows:
Attendance and performance in classes accounts for 60% and a seminar for 40%.
2. The whole summer program is worth 4 credits at Wuhan University. Students are required to obtain approval from their academic advisor in their home institution to transfer credits back to their school.

● **Notes:**

1. The 3-days field study internship in Dunhuang and Jiayuguan has some optional extra activities which are not included in the above mentioned fees. You can choose to pay for those activities such as riding a camel, sand skiing, sightseeing bus, ect.
2. The program will be ended at Dunhuang and therefore the students will be dismissed at Dunhuang. Also, the above mentioned fees do not cover the transportation fees from Dunhuang and afterwards.

Accommodation and Other Expenses (In Wuhan)

- **Housing** Students will be accommodated in Junyi Dynasty Hotel near the campus. Each room is facilitated with single beds, mattresses, desk, chairs, TV, Internet access and private bathroom.
