

2022 RUC International Summer School

Application Instructions

Since its inception in 2009, the International Summer School of Renmin University of China (RUC) has been an important initiative to promote the internationalization of talents cultivation. The International Summer School is usually held in July every year. During the International Summer School, RUC invites outstanding teachers from universities at home and abroad to provide full English courses for RUC students. Meanwhile, students from other universities worldwide can also take the courses. RUC International Summer School is committed to offering multicultural and multidisciplinary learning for students, promoting students' understanding of different countries and cultures, and cultivating their international perspective and cross-cultural communication skills.

In recent years, over 120 teachers from domestic and overseas universities offer more than 120 full English courses every year. And more than 3000 students of RUC and more than 400 students from other universities worldwide participate in the International Summer School every year.

2022 International Summer School will be held online from July 11 to July 29. Students from universities home and abroad are welcomed to join us online at 2022 RUC International Summer School in this July!

Duration

2022 RUC International Summer School will last from July 11 to July 29. Courses are usually taught at 8:00-11:30 or 14:00-17:30 or 18:00-21:30 (GMT+8) with one class every other day. 8 classes (16 classes for language courses) in total for each course.

Application Procedures

Step 1 Register

Register and fill your basic information in the above registration website.

After submitting your application information, please wait for the information review and the following steps can be continued after being approved.

Step 2 Check courses

2022 RUC International Summer School will have over 120 courses for you to select (see Appendix 1) . Before paying the registration and tuition fees (if needed), please make sure you have appropriate courses to select and without time clash if you plan to select more than one course.

Step 3 Pay registration and tuition fees (if needed)

Amount: RUC International Summer School Office will decide whether you need to pay the fees according to the nomination of your university. If needed, the fees should be paid before selecting courses. The registration fee is 800 yuan and the tuition fee is 10000 yuan in March, 11000 yuan in April and 12000 yuan in May for you to select 1-2 courses. And one more course needs additional 2000 yuan.

Methods and commission rates: Chinese bank cards, oversea bank cards and Ali pay and Wechat pay are all supported to use. If you use oversea bank cards, the commission fee needs to be paid together with the registration and tuition and the rate may differ according to the bank policy.

Step 4 Select courses

Once the registration and tuition fees have been paid (if needed), the courses can be selected. If the course you have selected has less than 5 students, which is quite rare (RUC students usually select courses in late May), the course will be canceled and you will have to change your course. If that happens, we will inform you through email instantly. And courses can only be dropped before the third class. As for students from Confucius Institute, one of the selected courses needs to be Chinese language course.

Online Teaching Platform

Voov Meeting will be used during 2022 RUC International Summer School online teaching. Please install Voov Meeting in advance (see user manual for Voov Meeting in Appendix 2). The teaching assistant of your class will contact you through email about how to join the online class.

Drop Courses

Courses can only be dropped before the third class. The details are as follows:

1.during the course selection period

Courses can be selected and dropped in the system.

2. after the end of course selection and before the start of the selected course

Courses can be dropped but not selected in the system.

3. after the course starts and before the second class

Courses can be dropped in the system; and only courses that has vacancies but has not yet

started can be selected.

4. after the second class

Courses can't be dropped after the second class.

Refund for Quitting

If you have to quit RUC ISS, the registration fee won't be refunded to you, but you can have refund for tuition. The proportions of refund are as follows:

95% of tuition for quitting before the first class;

90% of tuition for quitting before the second class;

50% of tuition for quitting before the half of the course;

0 refund for quitting after the half of the course

Score Check

Generally, the scores of your selected courses can be checked in the course selection system after one week of the end of the course. Before checking the score, please complete the teaching evaluation and questionnaire in the course selection system.
